BUILDING MAINTENANCE WORKER

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: This is semi-skilled work involving responsibility for performing a variety of routine mechanical and other building maintenance tasks and/or for serving as a helper to a journey level Building Maintenance Mechanic. In either case, although a working knowledge of one or more trades is necessary, a Building Maintenance Worker does not utilize the more skilled journey level techniques. In addition, the work may involve the part-time operation of a truck, automobile, or other automotive equipment. General instructions are received, and work is performed under immediate or general supervision, depending upon the nature of the tasks. Does related work as required.

<u>TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES</u>: (Illustrative only)

Repairs windows, doors, floors, walls and other parts of buildings;

Does interior and exterior painting where quantity rather than fine quality of work performed is the principal object;

Performs semi-skilled work in masonry, carpentry, electrical or painting operations;

Helps to install and repair general plumbing equipment such as sinks, toilets and baths;

Helps to install and repair wiring systems and electric fixtures and equipment;

Assists in cleaning and repairing boilers, pumps, heaters, pipe lines, valves and traps;

Operates trucks, cars, air compressors, snowblowers, lawnmowers, and other motorized equipment;

Mixes plaster and concrete and assists in laying brick, plastering walls, finishing concrete work, etc.; Replaces defective fuses or light ballasts;

Takes part in general grounds maintenance activities;

Performs a variety of grounds maintenance activities including snow and ice removal, and trimming of trees, shrubs, and lawns;

Helps remove snow and ice from walks and driveways.

<u>FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS</u>: Working knowledge of modern buildings and ground maintenance and repair practices; working knowledge of the practices and techniques of use of tools and materials used in building maintenance; mechanical aptitude; ability to read and follow instructions.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma; AND

- 1. One year experience in building construction activities; OR
- 2. One year experience in general building maintenance or building trades work assisting in one or more of the standard trades, such as carpentry, plumbing, electrical.

<u>SPECIAL REQUIREMENT FOR APPOINTMENT</u>: Possession of a valid New York State Operator's license at time of appointment and maintenance of such license throughout tenure of employment in the position.
