<u>Residency Requirements</u>: Candidates must have their domicile as Ontario, Livingston, Monroe, Seneca, Steuben, Wayne, or Yates County for at least one month immediately preceding the examination date.

> It is the applicants' responsibility to clearly show that they meet the **minimum qualifications** for the position.

Qualifications: County Values: All employees of Ontario County are expected to uphold and exhibit the County's shared values and behaviors to achieve the County's Vision and Mission.

<u>Minimum Qualifications</u>: On or before the examination date, March 15, 2025, to be eligible for this examination, applicant must meet the following minimum qualifications:

Note: transcript must be submitted with application in order to verify credit hours.

- 1. Completion of a minimum of sixty (60) semester credit hours; OR
- 2. Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma AND two (2) years of full-time paid work experience, or its part-time equivalent, in a uniformed position requiring police officer or peace officer certification; OR
- 3. An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (1) and (2) above.

<u>Substitution</u>: Possession of a Phase 1 Police Officer certificate from an approved Municipal Police Training Council Training Program may be substituted for thirty (30) semester credit hours required under (1) above.

Special Note: Education: Your degree must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. A list of acceptable companies who provide this service can be found on the Internet at <u>http://www.cs.ny.gov/jobseeker/degrees.cfm</u>. You must pay the required evaluation fee.

Special Requirement for Appointment: Possession of a valid New York State Driver's license at the time of appointment, and maintenance of Authorized Driver status with FLCC throughout the tenure of employment in the position.

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Minimum Qualifications: (Continued)

Special Requirement for Permanent Appointment: Candidate must successfully complete an approved Municipal Police Training Council Training Program for Peace Officer as described in Section 2.30 of Criminal Procedure Law and must be eligible to obtain a Firearms License pursuant to Section 400of New York State Penal Law.

<u>Anticipated Eligibility - Experience</u>: Applicants who lack thirty days, or less, of meeting the minimum qualifications by the date of the examination will be admitted conditionally to the examination. However, proof of the additional days' qualifications must be submitted prior to the establishment of the eligible list.

<u>Anticipated Eligibility – Age and Educational Requirements:</u> According to the amended Civil Service Law 54 (amended September 4, 2024), applicants who are within 12 months of meeting the minimum age or attaining the minimum educational requirements following the date of examination, may take the civil service exam, but will be restricted from certification until such a time that the age or education requirements are met.

Vacancy: This examination is being held to establish an Eligible List to fill future vacancies in this title, which may occur during the life of the Eligible List. An eligible may receive only one Permanent appointment from this Eligible List. If an eligible accepts a Contingent-Permanent appointment their name will be removed from the Eligible List only for the department or agency in which she/he received the Contingent-Permanent appointment. Once appointed, there will be a probation period of 8 to 52-weeks based on performance of duties.

Eligible Lists established by Ontario County Department of Human Resources are used to fill vacancies in Ontario County Government, its Cities, Towns, Villages, School Districts, Fire Districts, and public libraries, the Finger Lakes Community College, Geneva Housing Authority, and the Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES.

In accordance with Section 23-4 (a) of the Civil Service Law, **preference in appointment** may be given to residents in the jurisdiction where the vacancy exists. When preference in certification is given, an eligible must have been a resident of such municipality for at least one month prior to the date of certification and must be a resident of such municipality at the time of certification and appointment. Applicants must list a home address to be considered for preference in certification.

Job Description: The work involves responsibility for implementing and maintaining a campus public safety/security program to provide for the protection and safety of persons and property on the campuses of the Finger Lakes Community College. The incumbent is responsible for public safety, traffic, and property access control, fire and crime prevention and investigation, documentation and reporting of all incidents and relevant conclusions. The Campus Safety Officer enforces the Laws of the State of New York by virtue of the designation of peace officer by the Finger Lakes Community College Board of Trustees and is authorized by the Finger Lakes Community College President to possess and carry a firearm as part of on duty employment. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Director of Campus Safety and Security and Supervising Campus Safety Officer with considerable latitude allowed for the exercise of independent judgment in carrying out assignments. Does related work as required.

Special Requirement for Appointment in School Districts or BOCES: Per Chapter 180 of the Laws of 2000, and by Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, to be employed in a position designated by a School District or BOCES as involving direct contact with students, a clearance for employment from the State Education Department is required.

Background Investigation: The Finger Lakes Community College may require a thorough background investigation to determine suitability for appointment. Applicants may be required to authorize access to educational, employment, criminal history and other records check as part of such investigation. Criminal convictions or other offenses are subject to evaluation and may result in disqualification. Applicants will be required to submit the necessary fees for the fingerprint processing, where required.

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Candidates who are given a conditional offer of employment will be scheduled to take and pass the required medical/physical examination from a medical professional selected by Finger Lakes Community College. Drug testing is included in the required medical examination. The physical fitness and medical standards are reviewable at Finger Lakes Community College Department of Human Resources. Satisfactory completion of a psychological examination performed by a qualified mental health professional is also required prior to appointment. All standards are developed and administered by Finger Lakes Community College.

Subjects of Examination: A test designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and/or abilities in the following areas:

1. Preparing written material - These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

2. Applying written information in a safety and security setting - These questions evaluate your ability to read, interpret and apply rules, regulations, directives, written narratives and other related material. You will be required to read a set of information and to appropriately apply the information to situations similar to those typically experienced in a public safety and security service setting. All information needed to answer the questions is contained in the rules, regulations, etc. which are cited.

3. Following directions (maps) - These questions test your ability to follow physical/geographic directions using street maps or building maps. You will have to read and understand a set of directions and then use them on a simple map.

Candidates not having access to a computer or the internet may request copy of the test guide from the municipal civil service office conducting this examination using the contact information found elsewhere on this announcement.

Candidates are allowed to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with Typewriter Keyboards, Spell Checkers, personal Digital Assistants, Address Books, Language Translators, Dictionaries, or any similar devices are prohibited. Cell phones, SmartWatches or any similar electronic devices are prohibited. You may not bring books or other reference materials. You will not be permitted to use the calculator function of your cell phone.

It is the candidates' responsibility to keep their contact information (email address, phone number & USPS mailing address) current. To be considered for preference in certification based on residency, you must include the city and/or town/village and school district you live in. All communication is done electronically through the applicant provided email address.

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If candidate **fails to receive an admission letter** at least seven days prior to the examination date, you should contact the Department of Human Resources immediately.

Most written tests are held on Saturdays. If you cannot take the test on the announced test date due to a conflict with a religious observance or practice, check the box under "**Religious Accommodation**". We will make the arrangements for you to take the test on a different date (usually the following business day).

Disabled persons: If special arrangements for testing are required, indicate this on your application form.

CROSSFILER: Applying for Civil Service Examinations in Multiple Agencies When The Exams are Scheduled on Same Date: If you have applied to take a written test for other local jurisdictions (county, town, city) that is scheduled on the same test date as this written test, you must notify, in writing, each of the local jurisdictions no later than <u>15 days</u> before the test date of the test site at which you wish to take your examination. Arrangements for you to take all tests at one site are made through NYS Department of Civil Service. You must provide a list of all exam titles, numbers and locations for which you have applied on a Cross Filing Form. Click here to access the Cross Filing Form and once completed, please forward to: <u>hr@ontariocountyny.gov</u>. All examinations for positions in State government will be held at a State examination center.

*The required **NON-REFUNDABLE application and administrative fees** must be submitted at time of application. If your application is disapproved, the fees will not be returned to you. Do not send cash, check or money order. If you are approved and do not appear for the examination, you forfeit the fees as no refunds will be made. In accordance with Civil Service Law, Section 50.5(b), an exception to the fee requirements will be made only for persons who are unemployed and primarily responsible for the support of a household or who are receiving public assistance. The Fee Waiver Form can be found at the Ontario County Department of Human Resources website: <u>www.ontariocountyny.gov/HumanResources</u>.

In conformance with Section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, **children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duty** shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a maximum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

Any member of the **Armed Forces** of the United States of America, who having duly filed an application to compete in a scheduled competitive examination for Civil Service employment by the State of New York or any of its subdivisions and who due to active military duty is deprived of the opportunity to compete in such examination shall be provided with an opportunity to compete, under terms and conditions deemed appropriate by the State Department of Civil Service or Municipal Commission, by way of a special military make-up examination.

Veterans' Credits: Honorably discharged veterans may apply for additional points to be added to their final passing score on civil service examinations. The *Application for Veterans Credits*, the *Authorization for Disability Record*, and additional information regarding the requirements are available on our website at: <u>www.ontariocountyny.gov/HumanResources</u>. Completed forms must be received by this office <u>before</u> the Eligible List, from this examination, is established.

Public Service Loan Forgiveness Program (PSLFP) - The PSLF Program is intended to encourage individuals to enter and continue to work full-time in public service jobs. Under this program, you may qualify for forgiveness of the remaining balance on your (Direct Loan) loans after you have made 120 qualifying payments on those loans while employed full-time by certain public service employers.
