<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: This is a technical position that involves planning, designing, and implementing conservation measures on private and public lands. The incumbent assists the Conservation District Manager in overseeing field application of practices, such as agricultural best management practices, nutrient management planning, stormwater management projects and watershed management activities. An employee in this class assumes the technical responsibilities for planning, execution, and follow up of the application phase of a program. The incumbent is under the general supervision of the Conservation District Manager. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Either:

- 1. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in Natural Resources Conservation, Water Resources, Agricultural Engineering, Environmental Science, the Physical Sciences, Engineering or a closely related field AND one (1) year of full-time paid experience, or its part-time equivalent, in soil and water or natural resources management; OR
- 2. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with an Associate's Degree in Natural Resources Conservation, Water Resources, Agricultural Engineering, Environmental Science, the Physical Sciences or a related field, AND three (3) years of full-time paid experience, or its part-time equivalent, in soil and water or natural resources management, OR
- 3. An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (1) and (2) above.

<u>SPECIAL REQUIREMENT FOR APPOINTMENT</u>: Possession of a valid New York State Operator's license at the time of appointment and maintenance of such license throughout the tenure of employment in the position.
